The meeting started at 03:00 pm.

- I. The Vice Chancellor welcomed all the members of the Academic Council. He briefly appraised the members about the formation of the University under AP Private Universities Act 2016 and informed the members about the campus development and initiation of academic activities from July 2017. He presented the details about the current strength of students, faculty and staff, the laboratories available to handle various courses and facilities such as library, student clubs, and hostels. Further, he explained about the Fully Flexible Credit System (FFCS[®]) which VIT-AP is adopting for B. Tech. and integrated M. Tech. programmes.

Vice Chancellor informed the members about new academic initiatives such as multi-disciplinary group projects in every semester called 'Engineering Clinics' and compulsory Co-op programme under which every student is mandated to do final year project. He emphasized that all programme curricula have been designed to give students more 'hands-on' experience.

Vice Chancellor also explained the campus digitization started with paper-free examinations which are being conducted on digital exam pads. He narrated about the holistic development of students by participating in co- and extra-curricular activities and how the pedagogy is developed keeping these points in mind.

Vice Chancellor informed about the starting of a new 'V School of Business (VSB) from the Academic Year 2018-19 and introduced its Dean Dr. Jeyavelu to the members.
